u&i care offers a service of supported living and outreach care which is available to individuals of all ages with a range of additional needs, learning difficulties, mental health problems and/or with Autism Spectrum Disorder. These services can also be available through personal budgets and direct payment schemes.

Supported living or domiciliary care can be provided in the comfort of your own home or locations where you would like the support to take place, e.g. in private accommodation or another agreed placement, day centre, school, college or work placement. If the individual is looking for their own tenancy, u&i care will assist with the services users and their families in identifying the most appropriate accommodation dependent of their choice and needs.

Staff will ensure that they support the service users choice of hobbies and interests and to take part in community activities for promotion of integration and entertainment.

Based on the individuals needs, care could range from providing verbal or visual prompts, assistance without regulated activities, shopping or domestic duties, to washing, dressing, and shaving to complete personal care. All of which will be carried out with respect and dignity at all time, with the primary aim of promoting independence.
